## Values and Principles – Fact List

1. The UK has five key values: democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, tolerance, and participation.
2. Democracy means people choose their leaders through elections.
3. The rule of law means everyone must follow the law, including the government.
4. Individual liberty means people are free to make their own choices.
5. Tolerance means respecting people with different backgrounds, beliefs, and religions.
6. Participation means people are expected to take part in community life and support others.
7. Everyone in the UK has rights, such as free speech, freedom of belief, and freedom of religion.
8. Everyone also has responsibilities, such as obeying the law and paying taxes.
9. To become a UK citizen or permanent resident, you must show you understand these values.
10. You must also pass the Life in the UK test.
11. The test has 24 questions.
12. You have 45 minutes to answer them.
13. You must get at least 18 correct answers to pass (75%).
14. The test is taken at an official test centre.
15. Passing the test shows that you understand the UK's values, history, and society.
